



YMCA OF SNOHOMISH COUNTY 2021 IMPACT

The Y is grateful for the financial support donated by 1,600 community members totaling \$1,365,000 to date in 2021. Because of your generosity the YMCA of Snohomish County is delivering on our campaign commitments.



Hired 13 professional Youth Development Staff to develop and lead programs engaging thousands of Snohomish County youth. Through their work:



YMCA Summer Camp programs were held at 18 camp locations.

1,645 children enjoyed the magic of Y camp and began their 2021-2022 academic year feeling socially confident and ready to learn.

The YMCA is providing Early Childhood Education and Before and After School Care at 26 locations serving 57 neighborhoods.

No child or family has been turned away due to lack of financial resources.



540 middle and high school youth have received a low or no cost annual YMCA membership, ensuring they have full access to YMCA programs, services and Youth Development mentoring relationships.

Big Brothers Big Sisters mentoring programs have expanded into all six regional YMCA's.

114 Littles have been matched with Bigs to date on a goal of 180 mentoring matches before year end.



4,600 children have benefitted from YMCA progressive swim lessons.

This number will grow to 6,300 before year-end. Middle and high school age swim teams have been established at all six Ys representing nearly 200 youth. The first inter-YMCA swim meet was held at the Stanwood-Camano YMCA on July 31.

Kicking off this fall

- YMCA Leaders Club, a year-long, community-service based leadership-development program for middle and high school teens will be offered through all six county branch locations.
- MAP or the YMCA's My Achievers Program will kick off this fall through four program locations serving 100 minority and first-generation immigrant youth.
- YMCA Youth and Government is looking forward to a year of leadership and learning! Snohomish County youth will hold six key leadership positions including the 2021-2022 State Governor!



Nearly 7,000 households across Snohomish County will benefit from reduced cost Y Membership fees thanks to our Annual Campaign supported Access for All program.

The YMCA has established year-round youth sports programming including basketball, soccer, flag football, summer baseball and volleyball.



4,200 kids have participated with another 2,200 signed up to play this fall and winter.
